

Troublesome Parents?

An Exploration of the Relationship between Anxiety, Parenting, and Ethnicity

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Introduction

- ➤ Based on current literature there is an established link between parenting behaviors and the manifestation of anxiety during adolescence however mechanisms for manifestations are inconclusive (McLeod et al., 2007)
- Parental control plays a significant role in the manifestation of childhood anxiety (McLeod et al., 2007)
- ➤ High maternal acceptance is associated with decreased incidence of anxiety (MA & Philip C. Kendall PhD, 2014)

Research Aims

- 1. Examining the relationship between parental behavior differences and ethnicity
- 2. To evaluate the consequences of negative parenting behaviors on anxiety
- 3. To determine the moderating role of parental education on the relationship between parenting behaviors and anxiety

Method

Participants

Temperament Over Time Longitudinal Study; 366 subjects

Parenting

Behaviors

Anxiety

Ethnicity

- ►(169 male, 197 female;
- > 122 minority, 244 Caucasian/White)


Measures

- Parental Control Scale
- ➤ Parental Stress Inventory
- Child-Rearing Practices (CRPR)
- >Anxiety Variables (SCARED); total anxiety
- ➤ Parenting Styles Dimension Questionnaire (PSDQ)

Results

- Found statistical significance between restrictiveness and ethnicity with higher restrictiveness in non-Caucasian groups
- Neuroticism reported by the mother at 4 years was shown to predict total anxiety on the SCARED when the child was both 12 [F(1, 168)=4.868, p=.029] and 15 years old [F(1, 149)=8.05, p=.005].
- There is a significant relationship between anxiety and demandingness with education being the mediator
 - > Causal relationship

Maternal Education



- The higher the mother's education the lower demandingness predicts total
 - Anxiety increases and demandingness increases, but the lower the mother's the education the more demanding they are going to be, which leads to more anxiety An independent samples t-test was performed to look at gender differences

Discussion

- Negative parenting behaviors demonstrated a stronger correlation to the manifestation of anxiety than positive parenting behaviors but it was not seen to be a function a ethnicity.
- Nurturance at five year is a significant predictor of warmth and involvement at fifteen year
- However, no significant differences in nurturance or adaptability were found to be a function of ethnicity.
- There were no statistically significant differences found between gender and ethnic differences and puberty status
- Statistically significant differences were found between parental restrictiveness and ethnicity.
- There is a statistically significant relationship between demandingness and total anxiety with maternal education being the moderating variable
- There is a negative correlation between maternal education and the manifestation of anxiety and demandingness
- However we look at this model cautiously as the overall model is not significant but the individual predictors are

Implications and Future Directions

- Future research into the intersection of ethnicity and culture into anxiety and other mental disorders can help future clinicians to promote cultural competence when treating their patients.
- Ethnicity differences may not be as pronounced due the diversity of the sample and shared culture and recruitment from the same region.
- Specifically recruiting participants for specific ethnic groups could provide further insight into the validity of ethnic differences within child rearing



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
