### American Public Favors Safe Havens in Syria

#### [DISPLAY]

As you may know in Syria there have been large-scale demonstrations across the country calling for a more democratic government. The Syrian government has suppressed these demonstrations with military force, resulting in the deaths of thousands of civilians. Opposition forces are now organizing and there is the possibility of civil war.

The Arab League, a group of 21 countries in the region, has taken an active role in trying to deal with the conflict. It is demanding that the Syrian government stop its attacks on civilians, that the Syrian President step down, and for representatives of the Arab League to enter Syria and facilitate a democratic resolution of the conflict. The Syrian government has refused.

The Arab League has called for pressuring Syria by cutting off economic trade with Syria; the US and other countries have joined in these sanctions. But the Syrian government has continued its violent crackdown.
