LRIPF becomes reality!

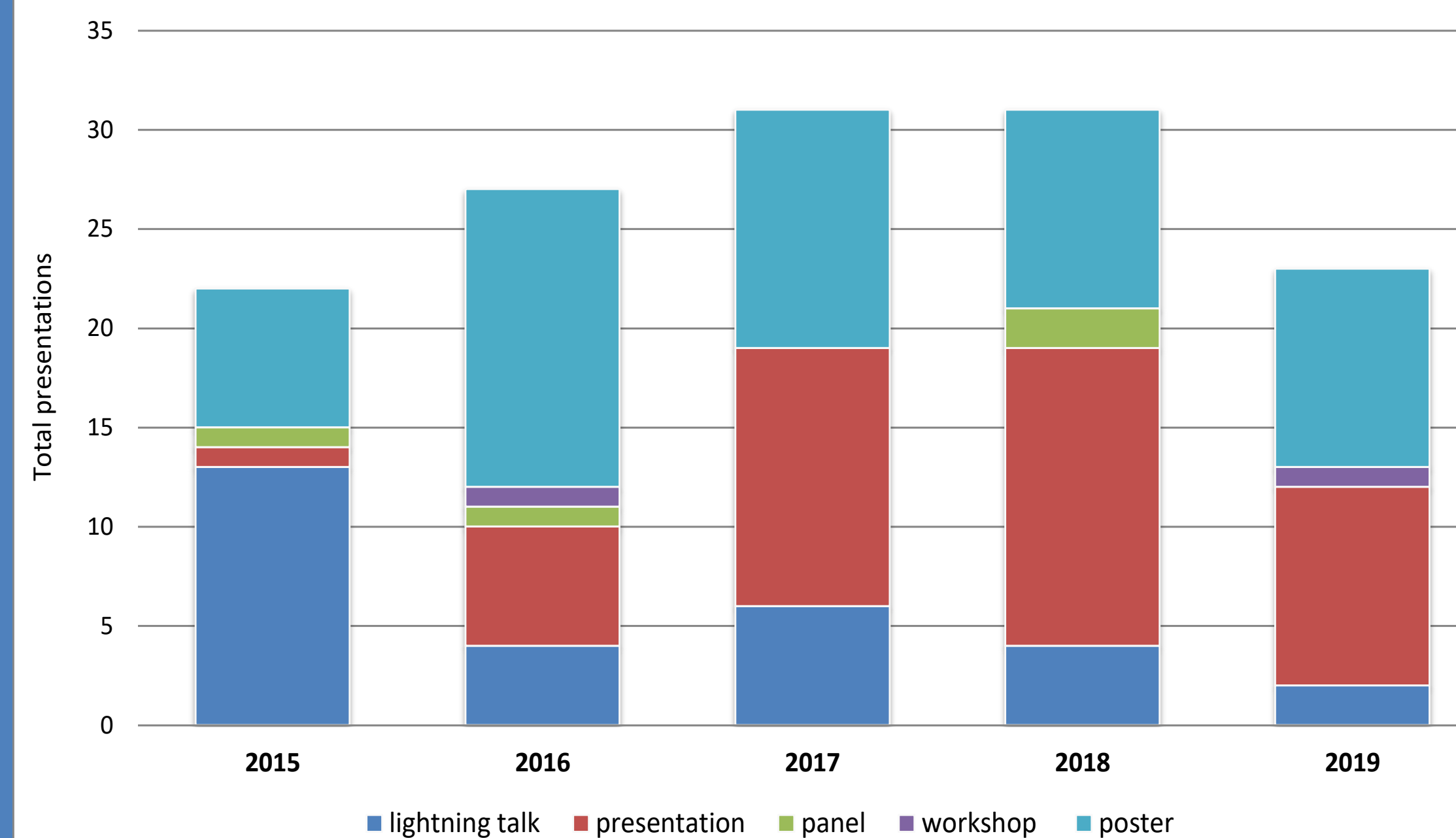
