

- Small local newspaper purchased by national news company
- ♦ Last minute need for home
- Administration agreed to take it

Information gathering revealed:

Scope and location of collection

* Transfer conditions of collection







Reasons to transfer:

- ♦ Warehouse space
 - ♦ Quantity
 - ♦ Time limits



More reasons to transfer

- ♦ Scope
- Resources
 - ♦ Staff
 - ♦ Ease of access

Transfer process

- Establish whether the collection needs to stay together or can be separated
- Find willing partner(s)
 - We went to the best-fit organizations first, then branched out
- Work with internal stakeholders
 - ♦ We have relied on support from our facilities department
 - Academic departments have weighed in on possible partners or curriculum support
- Work out a process with your partner(s) that adheres to your own internal policies and general best practices

Ford Foundation Transfers Early Records to Rockefeller Archive Center

April 10, 2012

The <u>Ford Foundation</u> has transferred thousands of items in its archives, including grant records, films, oral histories, and unpublished reports, to the <u>Rockefeller Archive Center</u> in Sleepy Hollow, New York, where researchers will be able to access them, the <u>New York Times</u> reports.






SHOULD IT STAY OR SHOULD IT GO? Using Reappraisal and Deaccessioning as Collection Management Tools

Reappraisal

The process of identifying materials that no longer merit inclusion in an archives and that are candidates for deaccessioning.



Deaccessioning

The process by which an archives, museum, or library permanently removes accessioned materials from its holdings.

• Collecting materials since 1844

H. Furlong Baldwin Library holds more than 7 million items

2005 when first official Library Collection Development policy written and approved



Backlog and Storage Space

- January 2021 regularly back onsite and time for a collections assessment
- Large backlog of unprocessed materials
- Running out of storage both for processed and unprocessed collections
- Due to lack of collection development policy and appraisal standards

Preparation

- Conversations about procedures with MCHC Museum Department and other institutions such as the Valentine Museum
- SAA's "Guidelines for Reappraisal and Deaccessioning"
- Survey of acquisitions spreadsheet
- Start by reappraising unprocessed collections:
 - Material no longer falls under the current Special Collections Development Policy
 - Over 5 boxes
 - Signed Deed of Gift

Results

- Establishment of workflow and documentation procedures
- Within 2 years approximately 50 linear feet of material has been deaccessioned
- The "Better Places" include:
 - Hagley Museum & Library
 - Baltimore Museum of Industry
 - McDaniel College Archives
 - The original donors

Biography/History: <u>Sam W. Pattison established the auction house in 1893 and in 1944 Sam Rea took</u> over as owner of "Sam W. Pattison & Co." located at 407 N. Howard Street. According to a son, Mr. Rea "was willing to auction almost anything. He often said he wouldn't sell food or livestock but would consider anything else." Mr. Rea retired in 1988 and the business closed. (info from Baltimore Sun obituary for Sam Rea, 2003 April 22).

Content of collection/series: Sales Records, 1932-1984; Clipping Books (Auction Notices), 1911-1969; Receiving Books, 1918-1923; Daybooks, 1916-1976; Cash Received, 1944-1966; Cash Books, 1927-1965; Journal, 1923-1931; General Ledgers, 1939-1966; Property Sale Contracts, 1917-1964; Appraisals, 1963-1984; Invoices, 1913-1967; Bills of Lading, 1980-1983; Retail Sales Tax Records, 1954-1969; Stores Bills, 1934, 1960s-1970s; Police Department Permits (Pistols), 1949-1961; Correspondence, 1934-1960s; Taylor and Creamer Auction Records, 1883-1888; Dance Instructions, 19th century; Printed Ephemera (business cards)

Has the collection been used? The business cards were processed and housed in the Ephemera Collection and the two dance instructions were processed as manuscript vertical files. The rest of the collection has been in the Enoch Pratt basement probably since 1988.


