Browse Collections

Constitutional Offices and Agencies

This collection encompasses websites relating to Maryland's executive branch, including the governor, lt. governor, attorney general, comptroller, and state treasurer. Social media sites associated with these offices are also archived here.

Departments

There are twenty departments operating within the executive branch. This collection consists of each department's primary website as well as any affiliated social media sites.

Independent Agencies

Websites in this collection relate to the various offices, commissions, boards, departments, and other agencies of state government established as independent units of government.

Legislative Branch

This collection archives the Maryland General Assembly website which provides access to House and Senate proceedings, bills, and session information.

Judicial Branch

The central website for Maryland's Judicial Branch offers a wealth of information regarding the state's circuit and district courts, as well as the Court of Appeals and Court of Special Appeals.

Intercounty and Regional Agencies

Agencies represented in this collection are those responsible for helping local governments to join together in solving regional problems.

Counties

Maryland is divided into twenty-four local jurisdictions: twenty-three counties plus Baltimore City. This collection focuses on archiving the local government websites for each county.

Municipalities

Archiving local government websites at the municipal level provides a look into the daily life of cities and towns across Maryland. Of the 157 municipalities in the state, 129 have websites.

Archived Website

Brought to you by a partnership between the Maryland State Archives and Archive-It.org, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization founded to create an Internet library. The partnership began in 2011 capturing Maryland state and local government websites as "slices in time". This fully-searchable site provides access to websites and government reports and publications that may no longer exist on current live sites.

Citizens Working to Enhance Maryland's Oyster Reefs

Welcome to *Marylanders Grow Oysters*, where hundreds of waterfront property owners are growing millions of young oysters in cages suspended from private piers. Their goal? To protect young oysters during their vulnerable first year of life, so they may be planted on local sanctuaries where the oysters enrich the ecosystem and our oyster population.

There is no charge to participants, but the rewards – both personal and ecological – are significant. By fostering these young oysters, our citizen partners are also generating an abundance of fish and other aquatic life and creating live bottom, populated by oysters and other creatures, on sanctuaries closed to harvesting.

Initiated by Governor Martin O'Malley in September 2008, *Marylanders Grow Oysters* is managed by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources in conjunction with the Oyster Recovery Partnership, the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science, and local organizations. Maryland Department of Public Safety and Corrections inmates produce the cages for the program.

Tred Avon Oysters Graduate!

Through July and some of August 2010, DNR collected the second year's batch of oysters grown under the program in the Tred Avon River. The oysters were cared for by over 150 committed volunteer oyster growers who tended 858 cages. **View a map of cage locations on the Tred Avon River.** About 250,000 oysters were collected, but final numbers are still being tabulated due to the need to quickly shift focus after the Tred Avon to an expansion of the program to 7
