Goal: Analyze the area competition to determine the feasibility of a farmer's market in Brandywine

Waldorf Farmers Market







- About 9 miles, 15 minutes from Brandywine
- Saturday 9am 1pm
- May through November
- Farm produce, cut flowers, baked goods, etc.

La Plata Farmers Market





- About 15 miles, 25 minutes from Brandywine
- Wednesday and Saturday, 9am - 2pm
- April through November
- Fresh produce, ready-made food, honey, local beer and wine, etc.

Montpelier Farm and Market









- 15 miles, 20 minutes from Brandywine
- Friday/Saturday/Sunday.
- F: 5-11pm; Sa: 10am-11pm; Su: 11am-7pm
- Open year-round: tours, agro-education and agrotourism

Bowie Farmers Market










- About 25 miles, 35 minutes from Brandywine
- Sunday 8am-12pm
- May through November
- Farm produce, chicken products, candles, some retail products, etc.

- Our research shows that Brandywine lacks nutritional food options in the area
- Four "grocery" stores in the area:
 - Costco (membership required)
 - Safeway
 - Aldi (recently added)
 - Target (sells groceries but not primarily)

- Residents of northern Brandywine have to travel to the southern Brandywine for grocery shopping
- The next closest grocery stores are in Waldorf, a 15-min drive or 50-min bus ride from southern Brandywine; a 20-min drive and no bus routes from northern Brandywine







Summary

- Brandywine area farmers have been identified and a contact list compiled.
- A preliminary survey can help determine farmers' interest in a farmers market and the products they might sell.
- Farmers' markets in the area have been identified to determine the competition.
- Data collected can be used to determine the feasibility of a Brandywine farmers market.

Future Steps

- Determine the number and type of vendors to create a successful market.
- 2. Finish the IRB submission process. Send survey to farmers.
- 3. Create a follow-up interview with interested farmers.
- 4. Use interview information to decide how to proceed with a farmers market.
