

EXCAVATIONS AT ST. ANNE'S CHURCHYARD, 18 AP 44, CHURCH CIRCLE  
ANNAPO利S, MARYLAND

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## ABSTRACT

Archaeological investigations at St. Anne's Churchyard, 18 AP 43, Annapolis, Maryland were conducted at three different times. First, in 1985, were the archaeological excavations of a trench in the churchyard which was to be disturbed by Baltimore, Gas and Electric. This area was previously disturbed as several disarticulated human bones were found. Second, in 1987, there was an excavation in the east yard to explore the brick feature which was being impacted by the digging of a planting hole. Archaeological explorations revealed a burial vault. In that same year, there were excavations in an area that was to be impacted by the construction of a ramp for handicap access. These explorations revealed several haphazardly placed burials all facing in an east-west direction.

There was a significant amount of alterations in the churchyard during the past two years, especially with the planting of trees and the trenching for an underground sprinkler system. There has been some previous disturbance in the churchyard when gas and water lines were laid as early as the late 19th century, but on the whole, there are many undisturbed colonial burials still intact. St. Anne's is an important cultural resource, and any other alterations to the yard should be preceded only by controlled excavations.

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## INTRODUCTION






Figure 2. Map Locating 18AP43 on U.S.G.S. Quad Map of Annapolis.




Figure 3. Location of 18AP43 on a Planning and zoning Map. Scale: 1in.=200ft.

St. Anne's churchyard, 18 AP 43, Annapolis, Maryland is located within zone 7 of the Maryland Archaeological Research Units (Figure 1, 2, 3). This work was divided into three phases.




Figure 4. Map of Site excavations

Our First involvement occurred during the summer of 1985, when the Baltimore Gas & Electric Company (B.G. & E.) placed trenches throughout the city of Annapolis, Maryland in order to bury electrical power lines. During this time, archaeologists from "Archaeology In Annapolis" monitored these excavations. On several occasions, heavy machinery uncovered human remains around Church Circle. In order to prevent such an incident from occurring again, B.G. & E. and Historic Annapolis, Inc. (HAI) agreed to perform an archaeological excavation along the path of a utility line through the eastern churchyard of St. Anne's, Church Circle, Annapolis, Maryland (Figure 4).


Excavations were performed from September 26 - October 4, 1985 which allowed the proper recovery of cultural material and any burials which might have otherwise been disturbed by heavy earth removing machinery. This work was directed by Dr. Joseph W. Hopkins III and was performed by a crew which consisted of two members for six days and three members for one day.

The second part of this project occurred between May 21-29, 1987. Archaeologists from "Archaeology In Annapolis" were notified of a brick feature that was located where a contract company was digging a hole for the planting of a tree (Figure 4). An archaeological team of one crew chief, Eileen Williams-Wood

Figure 1. Map of Maryland Archaeological research Units.

7.5 minute series.

characterized by being deep, well drained, olive colored, strongly acidic, and having glauconite (green sand) made up 40-70% of its soil profile at any point. The site area in particular naturally has a silty topsoil (Kirby & Matthews, 1973:38-39).

Prehistoric utilization of the land is unknown. Since the late 17th century, the knoll, the area encompassed by Church Circle, has been used as the site of St. Anne's Church. From about this time until 1790 the churchyard was actively used as a burial ground. Today, there is little indication that this was once an active cemetery, except for several alter tombs located in the north side of the church. Several alter tomb covers are placed around the immediate outside edge of the church. The churchyard is within the historic district of Annapolis and most of the ground cover consists of grass, English ivy and periwinkle. Trees within the churchyard include American plane tree, magnifico hackberry and flowering dogwood.

#### PREHISTORIC BACKGROUND

##### Paleoindian Period

The Paleoindian phase (13,000-7,000 B.C.) is not well documented in the northeastern United States, though evidence from the region suggest humans have lived here for 10,000-20,000 years. In the west, the most wide-spread complex is the Llano or Clovis, typified by fluted points, scrapers and blades. These artifacts are often in association with extinct megafauna of the

Pleistocene, suggesting a way of life centering on big game hunting (Humphrey and Chambers 1977:7-9).

In the east, however, finds showing evidence of Paleoindians are usually isolated fluted points (Steponaitis 1980:63). There are, however, several sites in the east which reveal evidence for Paleoindian occupation of the region. Two important surface sites are the Williamson site in Dinwiddie County, Virginia and the Shoop site in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The artifacts uncovered include fluted points, blades, scrapers and wedges, which are similar between the two sites and similar to the Clovis complex in the west. Two deeply stratified sites include the Shawnee Minisink site in the Delaware Water Gap and the Thunderbird site in the Shenandoah Valley. Both these sites yielded radio carbon dates that were contemporaneous with the Clovis complex in the west (Humphrey and Chambers 1977:8-9).

Steponaitis (1980:63-64) notes that while the eastern Paleo complex is similar to the western Clovis complexes, eastern artifacts have never been found in direct association with Pleistocene megafauna. Humphrey and Chambers (1977:9) state that eastern evidence is "...complicated by significant variation among artifacts both in minor detail and major form." Thus, the lifeways of the big game hunters of the west cannot be transferred to the east.

Instead, evidence suggests that the Paleoindians of the east had a much more diversified subsistence strategy. This is because of several factors, identified by both Steponaitis (1980)

and Humphrey and Chambers (1977). As Humphreys and Chambers (1977) note:

While big game hunters in the Great Plains and Southwest were ranging over thousands of square miles of essentially open grassland, their eastern cousins were faced with the great variety of ecological niches in the first coniferous, then deciduous forest which covered the land...human groups living in the forest must have depended increasingly on locally available plants, small game, reptiles and shell fish...This regional and seasonal variation in food and resources would understandably result in considerable variation in cultural adaptive strategies and their material manifestations.

Steponaitis notes that Paleoindian base camps identified by diverse artifact assemblages, non-random distribution of lithic debris, activity areas and post holes and molds, are found in riverine environments. Further, that quarry sites were identified by a lack of tools, and the presence of large amounts ofdebitage and a crypto-crystalline rock source. (Steponaitis 1980:66). This indicates that eastern Paleoindians were not following migrating animals but were occupying sites on a seasonal basis.

Investigations of Paleoindian sites have been hindered, as many sites are inundated with the rise in water level at the end of the Pleistocene.

### Archaic Period

The end of the Pleistocene saw many environmental changes, including the inundation of some riverine environments, a change from mixed coniferous forests to northern hardwoods, and a more temperate climate. The Archaic period is one of cultural adaptation to these changes and is further divided into sub-phases, known generally as Early Archaic, Middle Archaic and Late Archaic.

The Early Archaic (7500-6000 B.C.) is characterized by the appearance of two artifact traditions, the Corner Notched tradition (7500-6800 B.C.) and the Bifurcate tradition (6800-6000 B.C.). The Corner Notched tradition is based on the change from fluted points to corner notched points, reflecting a different hafting technique and utilization. The general artifact assemblages of Paleo and Archaic peoples are very similar, thus prompting some to infer that the differences between the two peoples were what they hunted (Steponaitis 1980:69-70).

The Bifurcate tradition involved the scheduled use of a number of seasonal available resources. The Bifurcates were made from Rhyolite or Quartz in the Appalachian Mountains.

Circa 6000 B.C. the weather changed from cool and dry to warm and wet. This marked the beginning of the Middle Archaic. This period is represented by several traditions, with the Bifurcate tradition possibly extending into this period.

Marrow Mountain points were part of a tradition extending from 5000-4200 B.C. These points were made of rhyolite and black chert, with associated assemblages of scrapers, large bifaces,

and four excavators performed a controlled excavation to explore what turned out to be a burial vault.

Third, excavations were performed on the south side of the church prior to being impacted by the construction of a ramp for handicapped access. This work was performed between July 29-August 11, 1987 with one crew chief, Stephen P. Austin, and a crew of two. In this last phase we were restricted in the depths of two feet in our excavations. The contractor, William Forsythe, claimed that if we dug to subsoil, this would add considerably to the costs of the project.

The 1985 excavations were solely sponsored by Historic Annapolis, Inc. with the cooperation of St. Anne's Church. The last two phases of excavation were sponsored by HAI and St. Anne's Church, along with grants from the Jacob and Annita France Foundation, Inc., the Maryland Commission on the Capital City and individual contributions by members of St. Anne's Church. Sponsorship by the latter three organizations were made possible only through the efforts and determination of Mrs. Margaret Kingsbury of St. Anne's Church.

These excavations would aid in a better understanding of the development of St. Anne's and the utilization of the churchyard. Most importantly, this excavation contributed to the long term project of recording the original topography and changes to the original town plan in the historic district of the city of Annapolis.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project area is located on the coastal plain of the Middle Chesapeake Bay region. Situated on the western shore of the Bay, the land surrounding the project area is characterized by rolling uplands with a wide diversity of deciduous trees and plants. (Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Tidewater Administration Coastal Resources Division 1979). The project area is located in Unit 7 (Figure 1) of the Maryland Archaeological Research Unit Map, which places the project area in the Gunpowder Middle -Back - Patapsco - Magothy - Severn - South - Rhode - West drainages. Specifically, the project area is located upon a knoll, and the surrounding topography gently slopes toward the Annapolis harbor (Figure 2).

Between 250,000 BC to 15,000 BC the Chesapeake area forests were made up of spruce, pine, some fir and birch trees. By 10,000 BC, the forests had become dominated by the oak-hickory, representing a more varied and thus more exploitable, environment (Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Tidewater Administration Coastal Resources Division 1979).

The substrata soils in the Chesapeake area are formed by unconsolidated sedimentary deposits of sand, silt, clay and gravel. These overlie a crystalline bedrock. Though the topographic relief in the area is not diverse, the sediments do vary greatly in depth, texture, and degree of permeability (Bush et al 1977:7). The soil in the project area is a Monmouth, fine sandy loam with a 0-2% gradient. It is formed from unconsolidated beds of fine textured sediments. It is otherwise

choppers, hammers, atlatl weights and axes. These peoples occupied inland swamps with transient camps on second and third order streams (Steponaitis 1980:76-77).

Another tradition was characterized by the Guilford lanceolate points made of quartzite. The assemblages were generally the same as the Marrow Mountain assemblages with the exception of scrapers being absent. The increase in the number of points indicates either an intensification of use in the area, or an increase in population (Steponaitis 1983:78-79).

The Late Archaic saw a change to a warm and dry climate and the beginning of an oak-hickory forest. During this time period (4000-1000 B.C.) there were several traditions. Two distinctive traditions were the Piedmont tradition with long stemmed points, and the Laurentian tradition, rare in this area. Also appearing for the first time is the broad spear which indicated utilization of new resources, possibly estuary resources (Steponaitis 1980:80-81). Seatite or soapstone vessels for storage originated during this era. As Humphrey and Chambers (1977:11) note, the native Americans were now heavily relying on fishing and mollusk collecting. These are all indications of an increasingly sedentary way of life.

#### Woodland Period

The transition from Archaic to Woodland is marked by the appearance of woodworking tools, such as axes and celts, and cordage impressed ceramics. Both types of artifacts reflect a more sedentary life-way.

The Woodland period (1000 B.C.-European contact-A.D. 1500) is also divided into three phases; Early, Middle and Late. During the Early Woodland period, the introduction of cultigens into the Ohio and Mississippi Valleys from Mexico resulted in changes in those areas. However, in parts of the northeast, the Archaic way of life continued until European contact (Humphrey and Chambers 1977:17). As Humphrey and Chambers (1977:17) note:

Pottery is the clearest indication of change in this early Woodland period. Changes in the frequency and distribution of Accokeek, Pope's Creek, and Mockley wares...indicate that shifts in food procurement strategies were taking place although all...predate the use of agricultural products.

However, no major changes in cultural patterns were noted.

Circa 1000-1200 A.D., cultivated legumes were introduced into the area. This coincided with the development of improved strains of maize. These developments produced significant changes in the population structure of the area (Humphrey and Chambers 1977:17-19). Thus when European explorers and colonists arrived in the Chesapeake, they found sedentary populations relying on an intensified and integrated utilization of natural and cultivated resources.

#### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Maryland was granted to George Calvert, the first Lord Baltimore in 1629, and was established as a proprietary colony. It was first settled in 1634 at St. Mary's, as this town became

the first capital of the colony. Maryland developed an economy based on tobacco export. With the majority of people living on tobacco farms, pursuing profit, there was little chance for urban development. The smaller farmers often relied on the large plantation owners for the processing and shipping of the tobacco. These large plantations were usually self-contained with blacksmiths, coopers, cobblers, as well as docks on their plantations (Middleton 1954).




Figure 5. 1718 Stoddart Survey of Annapolis.

As a result of the Glorious Revolution in 1689, Maryland became a royal colony under the sovereign rule of William and Mary. The capital of Maryland was moved from St. Mary's to Annapolis and Sir Francis Nicholson was appointed Governor of Maryland (Radoff 1971). In creating a city plan, Nicholson intentionally used a Baroque design for the political purpose of creating stability by using the church and the State House as the focus of his design (Reps 1965) (Figure 5).

Papenfuse (1975) described the city of Annapolis' growth in three phases. First was a period between 1694 and 1715, which was characterized by the town's seasonal swelling with the general assembly, and subsequent depopulation after the assembly left. Between 1715 and 1763, the town experienced bureaucratic growth and small industrial expansion, which increased the number of permanent residents. The era between 1763 and 1784 is known as Annapolis' Golden Age. This time is characterized by the decline of small industry, such as shipbuilding and tanning, while conspicuous consumption among the most prominent and

richest members of the colony residing in Annapolis increased tremendously (Papenfuse 1975:6).

After this period of grandeur, Annapolis declined as the social and economic center of the Chesapeake and Baltimore became the prominent center of the Chesapeake. Annapolis remained a small port town, relying on local trade as the basis of its economy. In the 1960s, Annapolis became revitalized with its main economic base generated by tourism.

#### St. Anne's Church

St. Anne's Church was established in 1692 by the Maryland Provincial Assembly. It was originally called Middle Neck Parish and by 1695 it was called St. Anne's. There is no record for the changing of its name, but it may have done so in honor of Princess Anne of England (Paynter 1980). In 1696, the assembly voted to build a new church in Annapolis. Three years later, Governor Francis Nicholson became an impetus for its completion (Riley 1887:69). The original church was T-shaped and faced the State House. Its dimensions were 65 ft. long, 30 ft. wide, with a 15 ft. porch and was in use ca. 1704 (Paynter 1980:13-14).

Riley (1887:69) suggests that the churchyard was used as a burial ground during the construction of the church and the graves extended beyond the limits of the present circle.

"[T]his is the ground about the church and is embraced in the present circle" (Riley 1887:69).

To accommodate its growing congregation, the church was torn down in the mid 1770s to construct a larger structure. John Ridout, Samuel Chase, William Paca, Upton Scott and Thomas Hyde

became the trustees for the church's construction. The American Revolution delayed construction and the second church was not completed until 1792. The new church no longer faced the State House but rather West Street, and its dimensions were 110 ft. by 90 ft. (Riley 1887). There is also evidence that utilization of the churchyard changed.

Paynter (1980:37) suggests that:

Construction of the church had disrupted the burying ground that surrounded the site in Church Circle. In about 1790 a plot of land on Dorsey (College) Creek was given to the parish by Elizabeth Bordley, and many of the graves were moved there from the churchyard at that time.

Not all of the burials were removed as Riley (1887:69) notes that "[t]he graveyard extended beyond its present limits into the streets as excavations within its beds proved a few years ago."

The second church remained standing until it was destroyed by a fire in 1858. This was rebuilt and presently serves as the St. Anne's Church.




Figure 6 : U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey 1844 Map of Annapolis

A review of some of the maps of Annapolis reveal the general development of Church Circle. Figure 5 is a reproduction of the 1718 Stoddart survey for the City of Annapolis. This depicts two perfect circles which were laid out for the church and the state house. The U.S. Coastaland Geodetic Survey of the Harbor and City of Annapolis (Figure 6) indicates that the Church Circle still maintained its circular shape in 1844. Between this time and the late 19th century, the Circle developed into an

elliptical shape (Figure 5 - 7) as the roadways around the church became heavily used. The changing shape and size of the Church Circle accounts for the discovery of human remains. Because of the shrinking nature of Church Circle, there were graves on the edge of the church's property which was already a roadway by 1790. There is also the possibility that some graves were undetected when and if reburial occurred. For these reasons, we suspected there were burials in the line of the B.G.& E. utility line, the area being excavated for the access ramp, as well as those impacted by the planting of trees.

#### SENSITIVITY

There are several aboriginal sites (18 AP 4, 18 AP 5, 18 AP 11, 18 AP 46) that have been recorded within the City of Annapolis. None of these are within the present historic district. Because Church Circle is close to natural water resources, 500 m. from the harbor and 350 m. from Acton's Cove, there is moderate probability that prehistoric sites would be found within Church Circle.

Annapolis was originally settled in 1649. It is most likely that the early inhabitants would have settled along the shorelines (Baker 1986). It is not until the later part of the century that the hill was used by Annapolitans for the placement of the Church and the graveyard (Riley 1887; Paynter 1980). Excavations at the Carroll Tomb (Dent et al) have revealed intact burials. Therefore, St. Anne's Churchyard has the potential of containing valuable cultural resources.




Figure 7: 1878 Hopkins Map of Annapolis

## RESEARCH GOALS

The only previous archaeological work performed within Church Circle was in 1984 when construction disturbed the Carroll Tomb and an osteological analysis was performed on the remains within it. Excavations at 18 AP 43 can provide additional information regarding colonial burial practices. Work at this site may also provide additional information regarding the Nicholson city plan of 1696. His idea was to create a Baroque design, using the two highest points in the city to place the State House and St. Anne's Church. How this plan was used, manipulated and changed through time may reveal Annapolitans' changing views of authority.

## METHODOLOGY FOR 1985 AND 1987 EXCAVATION

Due to the lack of time provided for 1985 excavations in the east yard, several modifications of our standard methodology were necessary. Test Units were defined as 2.0 ft. by 10.0 ft. and labelled 1-1, 1-2, 2, 3, and 4. Test Unit 1-1 was closest to the church and 1-2 was adjacent to this and included the area under the sidewalk. The later unit was excavated without regard to stratigraphy and was catalogued as unprovenienced material from Unit 1. Units 2, 3, and 4 followed an eastward direction, with Unit 4 being closest to the sidewalk (Figure 4 ).

The 1987 east yard excavations consisting of 5 ft. by 5 ft. grid with units designated as 5, 6, 7, 8. All but Unit 7 were excavated. Excavations performed in the south yard consisted of

three 4 ft. x 5 ft. units and were labelled 10, 12, and 14. Unit 10 was closest to the stair and Unit 14 was closest to the corner of the church (Figure 3).

All test units were excavated according to stratigraphic layers (except 1-2), and if any layer was thicker than 0.5 ft., it was arbitrarily terminated, then continued as the next designated layer. All layers were labelled alphabetically with upper case letters (i.e. A, B, C...) and all layers within a feature were labelled in lower case letters (i.e. a, b, c...). Each feature was designated by the upper case letter F followed by a number (i.e. F-1, F-2...).

Originally, any bone found was given a burial number (i.e. burial #15). Since only an occasional fragment of a bone was found and no articulating assemblages were noticed, this designation system was abandoned and all bones were collected in their respective strata and are represented in Appendix III.

In 1985, all soil was shovel skimmed and searched through with a trowel or shovel. Screens, which were a standard 1/4 inch mesh screen were only used when features were excavated. In 1987, all soils were shovel skimmed and troweled. All soils were screened through a 1/4 inch mesh screen.

All units excavated in 1985, except 1-1, were dug to about 3.0 ft. b.s. which appeared to be sterile. This was the total depth restricted by B.G. & E. to bury their utility lines. The 1987 east and south yard excavations were also restricted due to construction and space requirements. In the south yard, we were

limited to the depth of 2.0 ft. and in the east yard to 3.0 ft. By the request of St. Anne's Church, all analysis of burials were performed in situ, and therefore not removed.

Different data points were used for the south and east yard excavations.

#### FIELD INVESTIGATION FOR 1985 EXCAVATIONS

The proposed utility line trench was laid out by B.G. & E. and began 2.0 ft. west of the sidewalk which surrounds Church Circle in the eastern churchyard and was found across the street from the intersection of School and Main Streets. The southwest corner of the proposed trench was located 20 ft. north of the telephone pole across from the two streets mentioned above in the churchyard portion of the Circle (Figure 4). It continued 40.0 ft. in a westward direction to the electrical box located on the southeastern corner of the church. The southwestern limits of the trench were located 2.0 ft. north of the southwest corner of the church. For a more detailed description, consult the Unit Summary Forms (Appendix II), the Artifact Summary Forms (Appendix III), and the Unit Profiles (Appendix IV).

Unit 1-2 was excavated without regard to stratigraphy, therefore, only Units 1-1, 2, 3 and 4 will be referred to in discussion of the stratigraphy of excavation in St. Anne's churchyard (Appendix II).

Stratum A, which began at an average depth of 1.70 ft. b.d. in Unit 1-1, and sloped to 2.55 ft. b.d. in Unit 4, was removed to about 1.85 ft. b.d. and 2.80 ft. b.d., respectively. This

soil was the sod layer which was a dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) loamy sand and was mottled a very dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) soil.

Layer B was located below the sod and excavated to an average depth of 2.05 ft. b.d. in Unit 1-1 and sloped to 3.10 ft. b.d. in Unit 4. This stratum consisted of a very dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) silty loam with some brick and mortar fragments.


Stratum C was below B, and was excavated to an average depth of 2.80 ft. b.d. in Unit 1-1 and sloped to 3.80 ft. b.d. in Unit 4. The soil was defined as a very dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) silty loam. The end of this layer was defined as the transition to a lighter colored soil, a dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6).

After the excavation of layer C, arbitrary levels of 0.5 ft. were implemented for all test units involved, as fined grained changes in the soil were not detected by the field crew. Soil in these layers consisted of a dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/4) silty sand, dark brown (10 YR 3/2) silty loam, and brown - dark brown (10 YR 3/3) loamy sand.

Excavations ended at about 5.9 ft. b.d. in all units except for 1-1, which B.G.& E. only required excavations of a depth of 3.70 ft. b.d. All remaining test units were excavated 0.5 ft. to 1.0 ft. into sterile soil (Appendix IV)(Figure 8).

#### DESCRIPTION OF FEATURES

##### Feature 1

This feature was located in the southwest corner of test Unit 4 at the bottom of level F at about 3.98 ft. b.d. This soil was a brown-dark brown (10 YR 4/3) silty sand which was a thin layer of fill.

Feature 2 & 5

Feature 2 was located along the western boundary of Unit 2 and paralleled the sidewalk. It first appeared at about 3.05 ft. b.d. and consisted of a brown-dark brown (10 YR 4/3) silty sand. This feature was associated with trenching below the sidewalk for the placement of an earlier gas line (Feature 5). Feature 5 ran diagonally through Unit 2 in its southwest corner. This was a gas pipe that may date to the late 19th century.

Feature 3

This feature consisted of a dark brown (20 YR 3/3 silty sand and was located in the south central portion of the unit. It was originally located at 4.60 ft. b.d. and was bisected and excavated in three arbitrary levels. This feature was the result of a dumping episode of fill.

Feature 4

This feature was located in the northwest corner of the unit and consisted of a dark grayish brown (10 YR 4/2) silt. It was a product of modern disturbances which were created to plant flower bulbs.

Feature 6

This feature was located in Unit 1-1 which was adjacent to the church. This was a sewer pipe which ran in an east-west direction through the unit.

## FIELD INVESTIGATIONS FOR THE 1987 SOUTH YARD EXCAVATIONS

The following is a summary description of the test excavation units completed on the southwest corner of St. Anne's to facilitate a proposed handicap walk. Three 4 ft. by 5 ft. units were excavated. The purpose of these excavations were to generally describe the nature of the strata uncovered in the various test units and to retrieve any cultural resources which may be disturbed during the construction of the ramp. For a more detailed description, consult the Unit Summary Forms (Appendix II), the Artifact Summary Forms (Appendix III), and the Unit Profiles (Appendix IV).

Stratum A was a topsoil which consisted of a brown, very dark brown (10 YR 4/3 and 10 YR 2/2) loam. Its average elevation at the surface was 0.85 b.d. and was excavated to an average depth of 0.94 ft. b.d. Its T.P.Q. was 20th century.

Stratum B, in general, was characterized by a brown, light yellowish brown, dark brown (10 YR 5/3, 10 YR 6/4 and 10 YR 3/3) sand/loam soil. Cultural materials included some charcoal in Unit 10 and fragments of brick and mortar in Unit 12. The average elevation was 0.94 b.d. at the top of the layer to 1.03 b.d. at its closing. The T.P.Q. was determined to be early 20th - 20th century.

Stratum C consisted of mottled soil with brick and mortar fragments. It was characterized by a dark brown, dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/4 and 10 YR 3/4) sand/loam soil and was begun at an elevation of 1.03 ft. b.d. and was excavated to a depth of

1.32 ft. b.d. Its T.P.Q. was the early 20th century with some evidence of late 19th century inclusions as well.

The excavation of stratum D encountered lenses of sand and the brick and mortar which was found in the above layer was no longer evident. The surface of layer D occurred at an elevation of 1.31 ft. b.d. and it went to a depth of 1.40 ft. b.d. Sandy loam dark brown (10 YR 3/3) soil was present in the eastern two units while a sandy, dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) comprised the western most unit. Diagnostic material discovered in this stratum dated to the late 19th century.

Stratum E was composed of a generally darker, sand/loam, dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) soil. The surface of this layer was found at 1.40 ft. b.d. and it went to a depth of 1.62 ft.b.d. Mid to late 19th century artifacts were discovered at this level.

Stratum F was generally of a sand/loam yellowish brown, dark yellowish brown (10 YR 5/6 and 10 YR 4/3), although the western most unit (#14) encountered a sand/clay mixture of dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6)soil. This layer began at an elevation of 1.62 ft.b.d. and continued to a depth of 1.70 ft. b.d. Diagnostic material found in this layer yielded a mid to late 19th century date.

Stratum G consisted of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) mixture in the eastern two units, while a sand/clay mixture of dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) continued in Unit 14. The surface of this layer began at 1.70 ft. b.d. and it concluded at a depth of 1.89 ft. b.d. Cultural inclusions, including some

brick, charcoal and iron fragments, dated this stratum as a mid to late 19th century and late 18th century level.

Stratum H is difficult to generalize, as divergent soils disturbances were encountered. Unit 10, the eastern most unit, was characterized by a sand/clay dark yellowish brown(10 YR 4/6) layer which was mottled. Hard-packed sand/clay soil which consisted of a dark yellowish brown(10 YR 3/6) composed Unit 12 while a loose sand/clay which was a dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) soil characterized Unit 14. Units 10 and 14 contained diagnostic material dating this layer to the late 18th century. However, excavations at Unit 12 yielded artifacts dating it to the late 19th century. The surface of this level was encountered at an elevation of 1.89 ft. b.d. and concluded at an average depth of 2.14 ft. b.d.

Stratum I was composed of a soft sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) layer in Unit 10. Unit 12 had a sand/clay (10 YR 3/6) layer while Unit 14 consisted of a loose sand/clay dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) layer. Diagnostic material from this layer date it to the mid - late 18th century in Units 10 and 14, and the mid - late 19th century in Unit 12. This layer was encountered at an elevation of 2.14 ft. b.d. and concluded at a depth of 2.34 ft. b.d.

Stratum J is characterized by hard clay soil which was dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) in Unit 10. Unit 12 consisted of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) layer while Unit 14 was composed of a sand/clay yellowish brown (10 YR 5/6) mixture. Mid-late 18th century diagnostic artifacts were discovered in

Units 10 and 14 while Unit 12 continued to contain mid-late 19th century material. This layer began at 2.34 ft. b.d. and concluded at a depth of 2.48 ft. b.d.

Stratum K, present only in Units 12 and 14, was comprised of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/4) and a sand/clay dark yellowish brown(10 YR 4/6) layer, respectively. Late 18th century artifacts were discovered in both units, with some early 19th century material present in Unit 12. The surface of this level occurred at an elevation of 2.48 ft. b.d. and the bottom was determined to be at a depth of 2.72 ft. b.d.

Stratum L was characterized by a sand/clay yellowish brown (10 YR 5/8)soil. Diagnostic artifacts indicated a mid-late 18th century date for this layer. This stratum was encountered at an elevation of 2.27 ft. b.d. and concluded at a depth of 2.70 ft. b.d.

Stratum M soil was a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6). Diagnostic artifacts, including large brick fragments, date this layer to the mid - late 18th century. The beginning of this layer was discovered at an elevation of 2.70 ft. b.d. and went to a depth of 2.95 ft. b.d.

Stratum N consisted of sandy dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) and contained cultural material which indicated a mid - late 18th century date for this layer. The surface of this layer was discovered at an elevation of 2.94 ft. b.d. and the bottom was discovered at a depth of 3.04 ft. b.d.

Stratum O was characterized by a dark stain of a sand/loam brown, dark brown (10 YR 4/3). Although artifacts were

discovered, none of them were diagnostic. The surface elevation of this level occurred at 2.95 ft. b.d. and concluded at 3.06 ft. b.d.

Stratum P was characterized by a clay/sand yellowish (10 YR 5/8). Diagnostic material dates this level to the mid 18th century. The outline of a coffin was encountered which consisted of (10 YR 6/6) and was surrounded by sterile soil. The top of this layer occurred at 2.97 ft. b.d. and concluded at 3.16 ft. b.d.

Generally, the soil was not disturbed and occurred in chronological order with the most recent cultural materials found in those layers which were closer to the surface. Unit 12 was excavated to a greater depth due to the disturbance created by the burial discovered in layer P (Appendix IV).

#### 1987 SOUTH YARD FEATURE DESCRIPTION

The following is a description of those features discovered in the excavation units located at the southwest corner of St. Anne's. Five features were found in these excavations.

##### Feature 200

Feature 200 was found in Unit 10 and consisted of two layers and was present along the northern wall of this unit. The top layer of this feature (200a) was characterized by dark, organic soil a very dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) of a loam nature. It intruded through layers B and C. The second layer of this feature (200b) was located to the south edge of the unit and was very hard with brick. It was characterized by a sandy loam very

dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) soil. The surface of this feature occurred at an elevation of .70 ft. b.d. and continued to a depth of 1.50 ft. b.d. This feature may represent some kind of fill.

#### Feature 201

Feature 201 occurred in Units 10 and 12 and had two layers. In Unit 10, it was characterized as a dark brown line (10 YR 3/3) of a sandy loam nature which ran diagonally from the southwest corner to the extreme southeast corner. This feature began at a depth of 1.33 ft. b.d. and continued to a depth of 1.60 ft. b.d. in Unit 10. In Unit 12, this feature continued and ran diagonally from the northwest corner to the middle of the east side. It was discovered at an elevation of 1.56 ft.b.d. and it concluded at a depth of 1.69 ft.b.d. It has been interpreted as a tree root.

#### Feature 202

Feature 202 was discovered in Unit 12 and began at an elevation of 2.25 ft.b.d. and continued, for three levels, to a depth of 2.73 ft.b.d. It had a sandy loam texture and was very moist. It occurred primarily in the western portion of the unit. Its top layer was lighter in color, a dark yellowish brown(10 YR 3/4), than its remaining two layers which were a dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6 and 10 YR 4/4, respectively). It was apparently a fill or run-off area.

#### Feature 203

Feature 203 was discovered in Unit 12 and had two components. The first was a burial located in the northeast

corner of the unit, surrounded by the second component, the fill. Both components were composed of a clay/sand yellowish brown (10 YR 5/4) soil. This feature occurred at a depth of 3.20 ft.b.d. and concluded at a depth of 3.56 ft.b.d. (Figure 9).

#### Feature 204

Feature 204 was discovered in unit 14 and was a dark sand/loam dark brown (10 YR 3/3) stain running from the west side of the unit to the southeastern corner of the unit. It was found at an elevation of 1.90 ft. b.d. and went to a depth 2.00 ft.b.d. It was apparently a tree root.


#### Feature 205

Feature 205 was a soft, damp area located in the western portion of unit 14. It was comprised of a loose sand/clay dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) and discovered at an elevation of 2.60 ft.b.d. and concluded at a depth of 2.91 ft.b.d. The bone from a young animal was found with this feature. No decisive interpretations have been made for this feature, except that it may represent a tree root.

### FIELD INVESTIGATIONS FOR THE 1987 EAST YARD EXCAVATIONS

A summary description of the findings of three 5 ft. x 5 ft. excavation units on the eastern side of St. Anne's follows. These units were opened in order to examine a brick "pad" which had been discovered after a planting hole exposed it. Excavations revealed that it was a burial vault. These units were placed in such a way as to allow a determination of the

size, depth below surface, and age of this vault. For a more detailed description, consult the Unit Summary Forms (Appendix II), the Artifact Summary Forms (Appendix III, and the Unit Profiles (Appendix IV).

Stratum A was composed of topsoil with of a sandy loam black and yellowish brown (10 YR 5/6 and 10 YR 2/1) composition. It was located at an elevation of 2.37 ft.b.d. and reached an average depth of 2.55 ft.b.d. Its T.O.P. was 20th century.

Stratum B was characterized by a sand/loam brownish yellow, yellowish brown and dark yellowish brown (10 YR 6/6, 10 YR 5/6, and 10 YR 3/4) soil. Two of the units contained brick fragments. The top of this layer was 2.66 ft.b.d. and it concluded at a depth of 2.91 ft.b.d. Cultural inclusions date this layer to the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Stratum C consisted of a sand/loam brownish yellow, yellowish brown, and dark brown (10 YR 6/6, 10 YR 5/8, and 7.5 YR 3/4) soil containing large pieces of brick and mortar fragments. Diagnostic material found enabled a date of mid-late 19th century to be determined. This layer began at an elevation of 2.91 ft.b.d. and ended at a depth of 3.28 ft.b.d.

Stratum D was composed of a yellowish brown (10 YR 5/8) sandy soil although unit 5 contained a sand/loam brownish yellow (10 YR 6/6) soil. Diagnostic artifacts date this to early-mid 19th century. The opening elevation of this stratum was at an elevation of 3.28 ft.b.d. and closed at a depth of 3.56 ft.b.d.

Stratum E consisted of yellow (10 YR 7/8) sand in unit 5 and a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) in units 6 and 8.

Diagnostic artifacts date this layer to the late 18th century.

The surface elevation of this layer began at 3.57 ft.b.d. and concluded at a depth of 3.90 ft.b.d.

Stratum F exposed the vault. It was composed of a sand/loam - loam yellowish brown and dark yellowish brown (10 YR 5/8 and 10 YR 3/4, respectively) soil which was first encountered at a depth of 3.90 ft.b.d. and continued to a depth of 4.53 ft.b.d.

Cultural inclusions indicated a mid-late 18th century use of this level.

Stratum G (in units 5 and 8) was characterized by a loam/sand dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) soil in unit 5, and a sand/loam (7.5 YR 4/4) soil in unit 8. The top of this stratum occurred at an elevation of 4.53 ft.b.d. and the bottom occurred at a depth of 4.94 ft.b.d. Diagnostic materials revealed a range of mid-late 18th century use.

Stratum H consisted of a loam/sand dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) and a sand/loam brown-dark brown (7.5 YR 4/4) in units 5 and 8, respectively. This layer may represent the disturbed area which was excavated for the reentrance to the vault. This was located in unit 5. The top of this stratum began at an elevation of 4.94 ft.b.d. and continued to a depth of 5.25 ft.b.d.

Cultural inclusions indicate a mid-late 18th century use of this layer.

Stratum I, the last layer in unit 5, was a continuation of stratum H and also represents the reexcavated soil to the entrance to the vault. The soil was of a sand/clay dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6). In unit 8, the soil continued as a

sand /loam strong brown (7.5 YR 4/6). Diagnostic cultural material reveals a mid-late 18th century use. The opening elevation of this stratum began at 5.25 ft.b.d. and finished at a depth of 5.74 ft.b.d.

Stratum J, the last level of unit 8, consisted of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) soil. Artifacts indicate a mid-late 18th century use of this layer. It began at an elevation of 6.24 ft.b.d. and reached a depth of 6.56 ft.b.d.

#### 1987 EAST YARD FEATURE DESCRIPTION

##### Feature 100

Seven features were revealed in the east yard excavations. Feature 100 discovered in unit 8 was a builder's trench for a contemporary sidewalk. It consisted of a sand/loam brown-dark brown (10 YR 4/3) soil and began at an elevation of 2.35 ft.b.d. and continued to a depth of 3.31 ft.b.d. Artifacts reveal a 20th century construction date of this trench.

##### Feature 101

Feature 101 located in unit 8 was comprised of two layers. The first layer revealed a series of mortared bricks, while the second layer consisted of the soil beneath these bricks. The bricks were discovered at a depth of 3.74 ft.b.d., placing them in layer D. The soil which was located beneath these bricks was

of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6). Cultural material indicates a late 18th century date for this layer.

#### Feature 102




Figure 10. Feature 102 in Units 5 and 6.

Feature 102, the buriel vault, was originally revealed in unit 5 and was below layer F. It was found at an elevation of 3.69 b.d. and reached a depth of 4.28. The surrounding soil was a sand/loam nature (10 YR 5/6). Diagnostic artifacts suggest a late 18th century date for this feature (Figures 10 + 11).

#### Feature 103

Feature 103 was found in unit 5 and was a shallow sand/clay yellowish brown (10 YR 5/6) stain. It was discovered at the bottom of layer F and was a lense of soil. The surface of this feature occurred at an elevation of 3.60 ft.b.d., reaching a depth of 3.80 ft.b.d. Cultural inclusions date it to the late 18th century.

#### Feature 104

Feature 104 was revealed in unit 5, and was a loosely packed sandy loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 4/6) soil located to the south of the vault. It consisted of a single layer ranging from 3.94 ft.b.d. to 4.21 ft.b.d. It overlaid the brick apron of the vault. It contained few artifacts and was possibly the result of root activity or some form of later disturbance. Diagnostic artifacts suggest a late 18th century date for this feature.

Although no archaeological excavations were conducted in this area beyond units 5, 6, and 8, a planting hole which had been created by the workmen, 7 ft. north of the northern boundary of Unit 7, was labeled as feature 105. This hole revealed the




Figure 11. Feature 102 in Unit 8.

brick rubble which was covered with mortar. No artifacts were discovered and no elevation measurements were taken.

#### Feature 106

Feature 106 was found in unit 8 and consisted of two layers. Believed to be a builder's trench for feature 101, feature 106 lies to the north and is right next to the edge of the vault. The first layer is comprised of a loam/sand dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) soil and started at an elevation of 5.11 ft.b.d. and ended at a depth of 5.50 ft.b.d. Diagnostic material indicates a date of mid-late 18th century.

#### Feature 107

Feature 107 was discovered in unit 8, at the top of layer K. It is possibly the outline of a coffin to the north of this unit. Although it was not excavated, it occurred at a depth of 5.48 b.d. The soil was of a sand/loam dark yellowish brown (10 YR 3/6) nature. Associated material suggests a mid-late 18th century date for this feature.

### INTERPRETATION - 1985 SOUTH YARD EXCAVATION

The 1985 excavations were in the same place where prior disturbances occurred for the placement of water, gas and electrical lines. Therefore, no intact burials were found, but rather a scatter of osteological remains throughout all layers of soil with the heaviest concentration in the lower layers.

INTERPRETATION - 1987 EAST YARD EXCAVATION

The excavations which took place at St. Anne's yielded valuable information concerning the mid-late 18th century use of this property. Those units which were excavated on the eastern side of St. Anne's revealed not only a burial vault, but also a site of high integrity.

All of the soil found in this area is undisturbed and follows in natural chronological order. Most significantly is stratum E, a layer of sterile sand located just above the burial vault (F 102). This stratum was sand and was probably layered over the vault during the construction of the second church in 1790. Whether this was accidental or intentional it is not known (Appendix IV).

It is significant that these burials were not removed in 1790, during the construction of the second church on this property, when they were assigned to be moved to the college Creek cemetery (see Paynter 1980). The presence of burials in and around the vault, as well as in the southwestern units (10, 12, and 14), suggest that many of the burials were left undisturbed (Appendix IV).

Feature 103, the brick burial vault, was laid in English bond. Its dimensions were 5 ft. by 5 ft. by 5 ft. It contained the remains of four individuals: two males, one female, and one unidentified. They were wrapped in shrouds and placed in hexagonal shaped coffins. All were covered with lime, presumably to diminish the odor of the decaying bodies. The use of lime may

indicate that they were transported to the vault from some distance.

The wooden coffins were constructed of cedar and held together by hand wrought nails. Their placement within the vault consisted of three coffins laid side by side in an east-west orientation, with heads on the west side, feet on the east side. Directly on top of these coffins were two wooden planks made of cedar. Upon these planks the final coffin, containing the female individual was placed.

Since the burials could not be removed, Dr. R.J. Dent of the Department of Anthropology at the University of Maryland College Park, performed a cursory analysis of the osteological remains. The two male individuals have an estimated age at death of forty years. The age of the unidentified individual was undetermined. The female individual's age has been estimated to be about 50 years old.

In addition, the female burial was placed in a coffin which had a silver plate incorporated into the top of its surface. On it was inscribed the words:

Margaret Bordley the  
Wife of John Beale Bordley

1773

Research conducted on John Beale Bordley reveal that he was the youngest son of Stephen Bordley, one of the wealthiest individuals in Annapolis in the first quarter of the 18th century. Margaret Bordley's maiden name was Margaret Chew and she was part of another prominent family in 18th century

Annapolis. She inherited part of Wye Island from her father where she and her husband moved soon after.

Layers G, H, and I, found to the west of the burial vault, are disturbed and it is very likely that this occurred with the excavation of this area to gain access to the vault.

The discovery of the outline of another coffin (F 107) in addition to the general mottling of the soil strata suggest that burials took place in an unorganized fashion, by contemporary standards. The construction of the Bordly vault disturbed this burial and probably displaced several others. It is likely that burials were disturbed often during the interment of other individuals. These burials were poorly marked, not marked at all, or perhaps simply ignored. If markers were constructed of wood, it is possible that their deterioration made it difficult to avoid previous burials.

#### INTERPRETATION - 1987 SOUTH YARD EXCAVATION


The excavations which occurred at the southwestern section of St. Anne's Church revealed stratigraphy which is apparently composed of undisturbed soil. These units (10, 12, and 14) contained cultural material largely from the 19th century. The earliest diagnostic artifacts presented are from the mid 18th century.

The absence of earlier material may provide evidence for possible modifications taking place within the church circle sometime around the third quarter of the 18th century. This landscaping was important toward creating illusions in redefining

the prominence of the church in the colonial capital. No longer was there a steep slope from the outer perimeter of the circle to the church. Soil was moved from the top of the hill to its perimeter. This created the illusion through the landscape of a church not as prominently displayed or dominating its surrounding community. This may reflect the diminishing importance of the church in colonial affairs (Appendix IV).

Lower strata (J-P) contain coffin stains, some of which demonstrate that burials often intruded upon other burials (Figure 12). This haphazard method of interment is typical of 17th and early 18th century cemeteries in colonial America. Also of note is the shallow depths of these graves. From the 20th century strata they were located about 2.0 ft. b.s., and are no more than 1.0 ft. below the earliest 19th century layer. Since the soil has been observed in chronological order with out interruptions, it is unlikely that there were any modifications, or scraping of soil after these interments. Thus, these burials were placed no more than 1.0 ft. below their contemporaneous ground surface. The location of these burials also indicates that not all of them were removed in 1790, when they were supposed to be exhumed and reinterred at the new St. Anne's cemetery on College Creek (see Paynter 1980). It is most probable that many unmarked and undiscovered burials remain around St. Anne's, possibly dating as far back as the late 17th century.

The excavations at the St. Anne's site unequivocally demonstrated the significance of the cultural resources which are preserved there. The information which this high integrity site could yield includes evidence concerning colonial mortuary practices, health and nutrition, medical practices, stature, and the development of the city's Baroque plan. It is recommended that the area surrounding St. Anne's should not be impacted under any circumstances, unless it is through systematic, controlled archaeological excavations.
